The City Council of the City of Columbiana, Alabama met in a Regular Session in the Council Chambers of Columbiana City Hall at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 5, 2024. Mayor David Mitchell called the meeting to order and asked City Clerk, Charlene Tucker, to call roll after the invocation and pledge.

- We will be offering English Computer classes starting Thursday, March 14th, 3:30-4:30. Space is limited and there are 8 spots available.

- Sewer lines are in fair condition.

BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Columbiana, Alabama wishes to inform the Department of Environmental Management that the following actions were taken by the City Council at a regular meeting held on March 5, 2024.

- 1. Reviewed the MWPP Annual Report which is attached to this resolution.
- 2. Set forth the following actions and schedule necessary to maintain effluent requirements contained in the NPDES Permit, and to prevent the bypass and overflow of raw sewage within the collection system or at the treatment plant.
 - a. Currently working on upgrading the collection system as funds become available.
 - b. The City has plans to start rebuilding the sewer treatment plant in 2024.
 - c. The Sewer Department is currently looking for inflow and infiltration (I&I) in the system by means of video and smoke testing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the City of Columbiana does adopt the above actions into its Municipal Water Pollution Prevention Program. The motion was made by Council Member King and seconded by Council Member Phillips and passed by a vote of the Council.
