DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS

- Admin City Clerk Charlene Tucker reported that the heat unit in the conference room will be installed tomorrow. The new circuit switch through AT&T was installed today. That will help reduce the cost of the City's phone bill and help with connectivity.
- **Library** Shelia Gallups reported that the library's computer equipment has arrived and she is waiting on IT to install everything. There will be a teen band night on the 14th at 4:30 pm. This is a new event where teens can bring their instruments and play together.

- Streets Allen Reynolds reported that his department has been busy taking Christmas decorations down. They are replacing ports on the garbage truck. He is down three employees in his department.
- Police Chief Jeff Bowers reported that his department just finished an ADECA grant for traffic
 control and will be starting another one for distracted driving. They are working on training for
 the year. He is trying to find training in the state but may have to go to Meridian, Mississippi.
 Those classes are free we would just have to pay for gas to get there. Porch thefts are on a rise.
 The latest one was on Mildred Street. If possible, have packages delivered when someone is home.
- Fire Chief Johnny Howard, Jr. reported that his department responded to 55 more calls in 2019 than 2018. The storm shelters have been cleaned and need some maintenance. Brett Ashworth is attending officer development training.
- Environmental Dale Lucas reported that his department has been busy replacing air relief valves from Cornerstone Christian School to Chelsea Road. They are working on the lift station at the Shelby County Highway Department shop.

WHEREAS, after holding a public hearing on the matter, the Columbiana Planning and Zoning Commission has recommended that, at the request of the property owner, this parcel be rezoned from the B-1 to M-1, subject to certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, the Columbiana City Council has held a public hearing on the Columbiana Planning and Zoning Commission's recommendation and carefully considered the said recommendation and the comments thereon;

WHEREAS, the Columbiana City Council has held a public hearing on the Columbiana Planning and Zoning Commission's recommendation and carefully considered the said recommendation and the comments thereon;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIANA, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

AUTHORIZING MAYOR TO SIGN A CONTRACT WITH RDS FOR BUSINESS LICENSE DISCOVERY/RECOVERY AND SALES TAX COLLECTION

- 1. That the City enter into a contract with RDS for business license discovery and recovery services, and for remittance processing for sales and use taxes, which contracts are before this council;
- 2. That the contracts be executed in the name of the City, for and on behalf of the City, by its Mayor.
- 3. That the contracts be attested by the Clerk and the seal of the City affixed thereto.
- 4. That RDS will receive an amount equal to fifty percent (35%) of business license revenue collected by RDS and an amount equal to \$3.00 per business license application mailed or faxed to the City
- 5. That the agreement is for a period of 36 months from the effective date unless terminated by either party.

AWARD OF BID - MAINTENANCE OF BALL FIELDS

ORDINANCE NO. 01-20-01

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TWO HOUR PARKING

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIANA, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

The following named and described areas, streets or portions of streets shall be two-hour limited time parking zones between the hours of 8:00 am and 5:00 pm on Mondays through Fridays:

- (1) North Main Street from the red light to Carter's Lane.
- (2) South Main Street from the red light to the roundabout.
- (3) East College from the red light to Milner Street.

It shall be unlawful and a violation of this ordinance for any person to remove chalk or other markings made by a city employee to show when a vehicle was parked, or to move a car in order to evade the period established for legal parking in any two hour parking zone.

It shall be the duty of the chief of police and other police officers, or any other person so named by the city council, to check parking spaces and report violations of this article in the following manner:

- (1) Keep an account of and report the location of each parking space where a vehicle has been parked in violation of this ordinance, the date and hour of such violation, the make and the state license number of such vehicle, and any other facts which is necessary for a thorough understanding of the circumstances attending such violation.
- (2) Attach to such vehicle notice stating that it has been parked in violation of this ordinance and instructing the owner or operator to report at a certain designated time and place to the municipal court in regard to such violation.

The city hereby adopts the minimum fines for two hour parking violations.

If any vehicle is found parked in violation of this ordinance shall be fined \$15.00. After five unpaid citations, the amount shall increase to \$30.00. Such vehicle may be towed away by the police department at the owner's or driver's expense if it has been parked for longer than 72 hours. Vehicles towed away for illegal parking shall be stored in a safe place and shall be

restored to the owner or operator upon payment of the applicable parking violation fine and the cost of vehicle removal and storage. The police department shall maintain a record of each vehicle towed, including the original location, the storage site, the reason for towing and the name of the officer authorizing the tow.

All ordinances and portions of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

This Ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and publication or posting as required by law.
